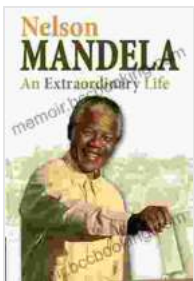

Winston Churchill

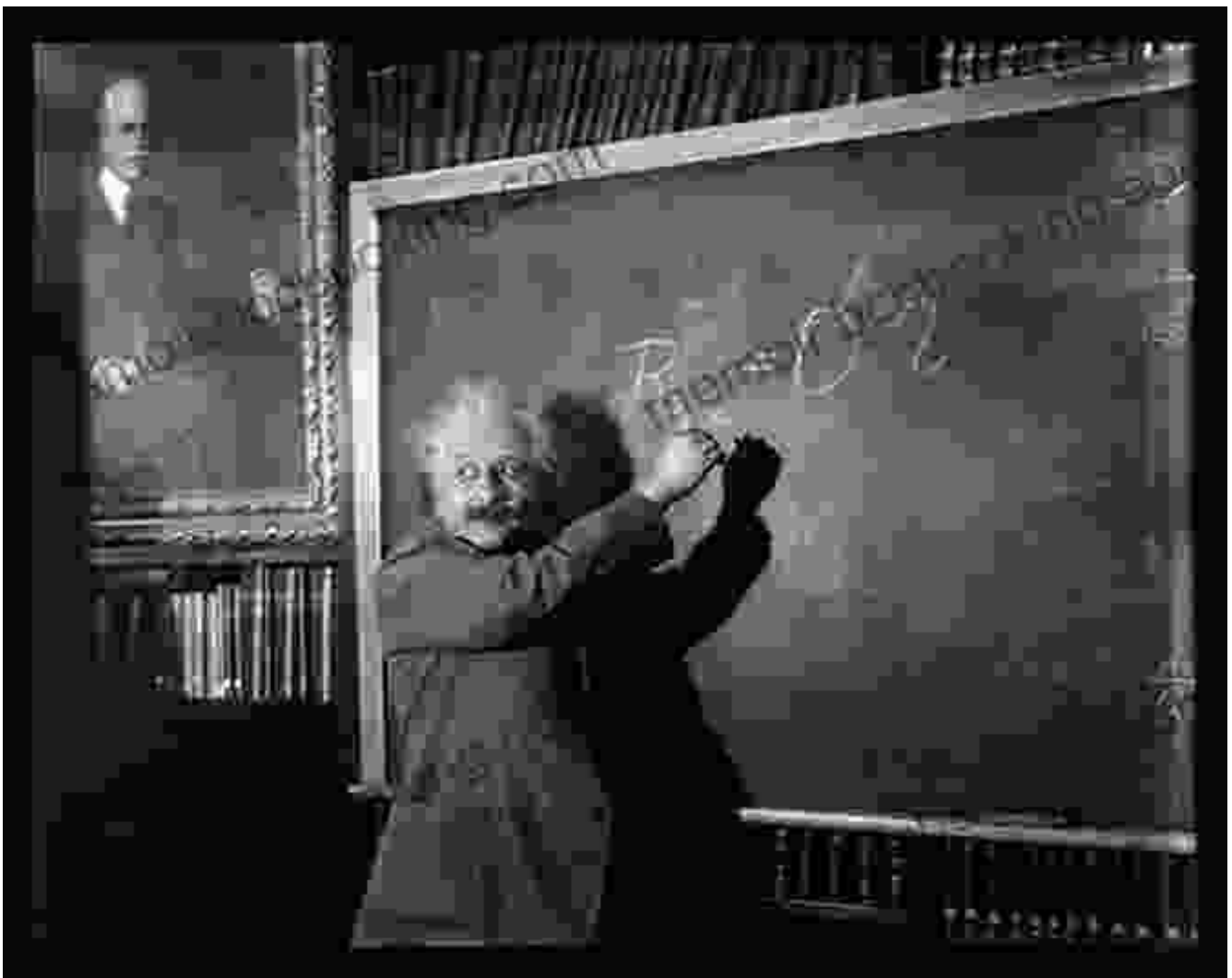

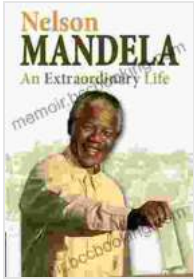

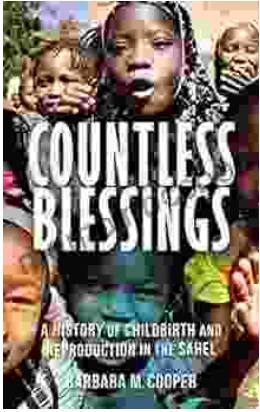
