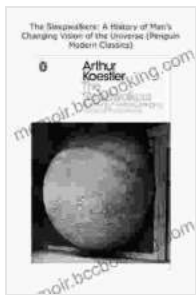

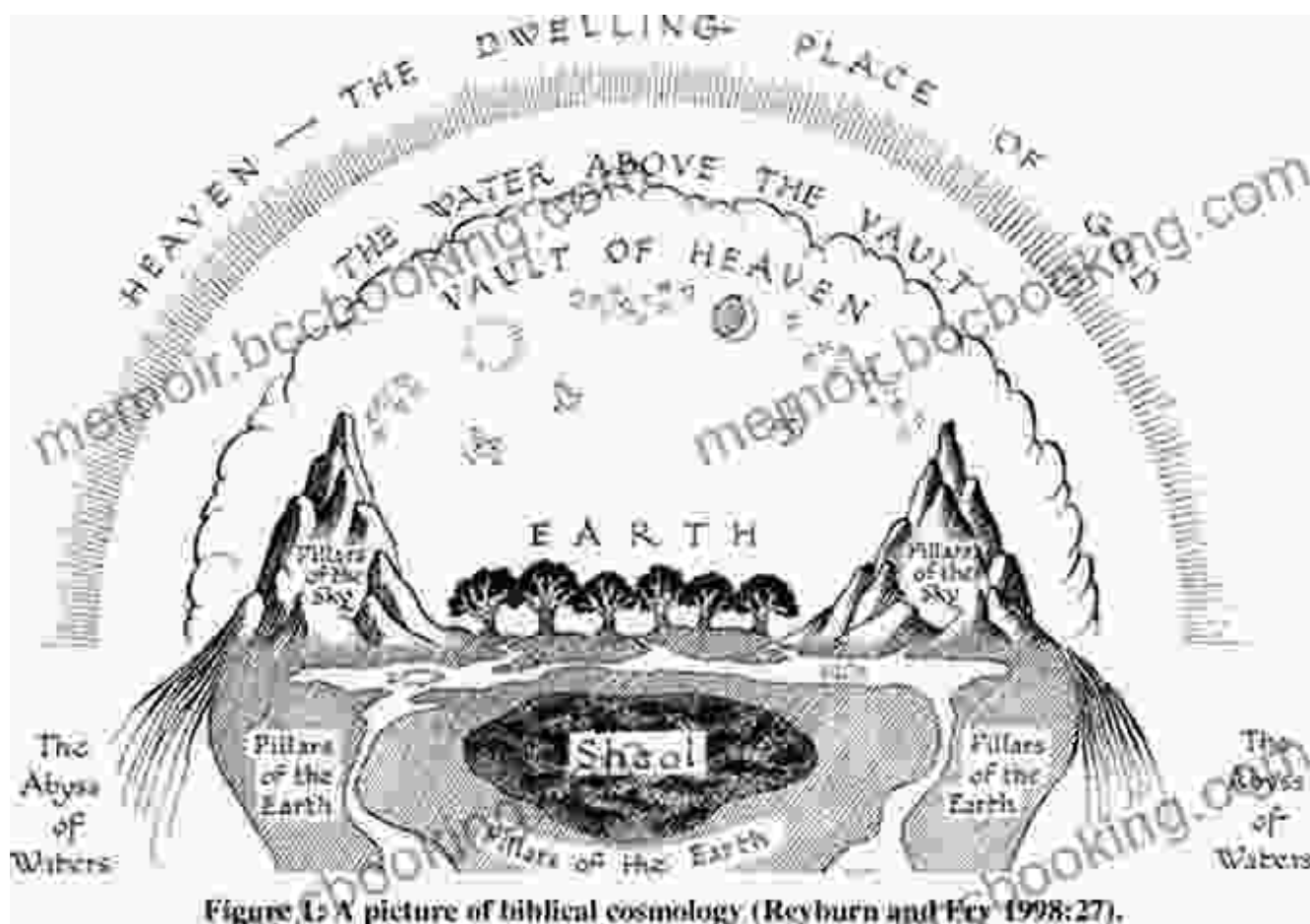
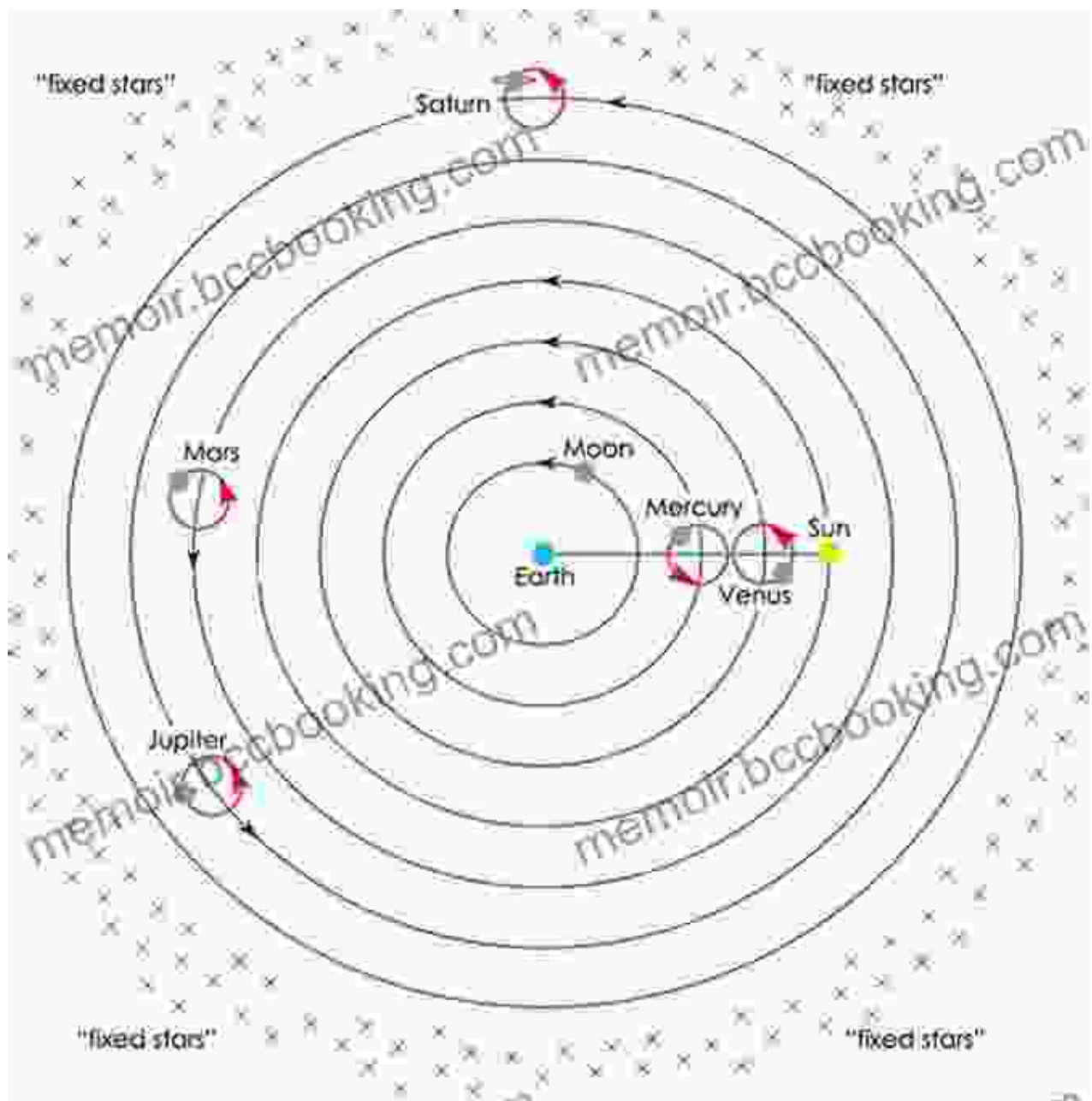


Figure 1.5 A picture of biblical cosmology (Reyburn and Fey 1998:27).

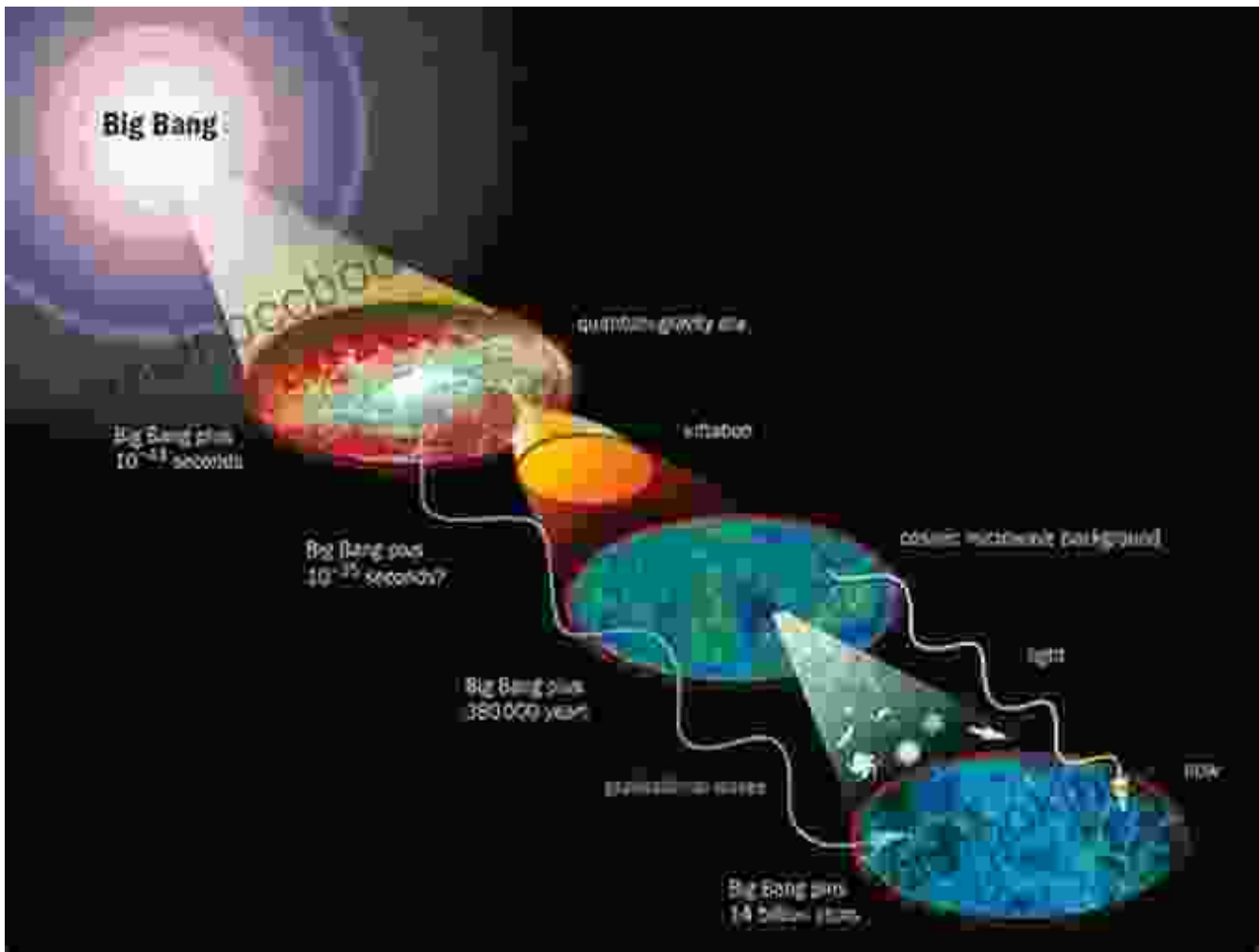


The Copernican heliocentric model of the solar system, with the Sun at the center and the Earth and other planets orbiting around it.

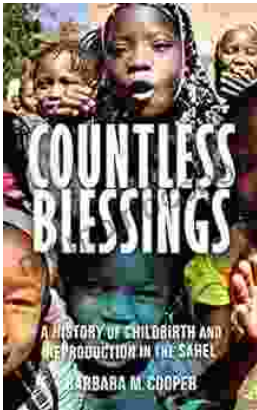
