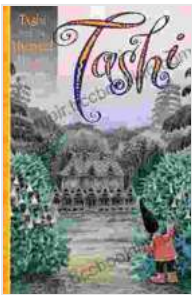

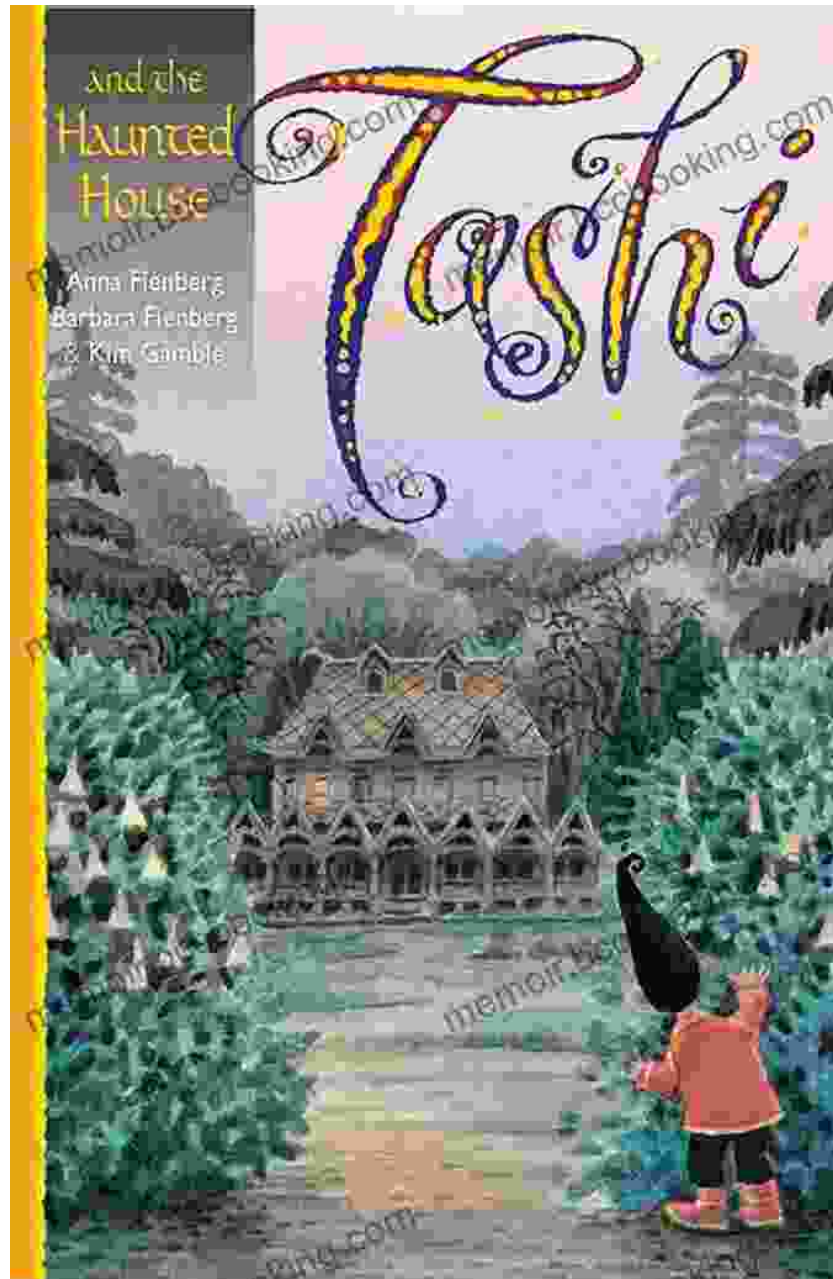
The ghost let out a piercing wail, and Tashi screamed in terror. He turned and ran, but the ghost was faster. It chased Tashi down the stairs and into the living room.

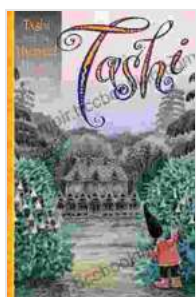

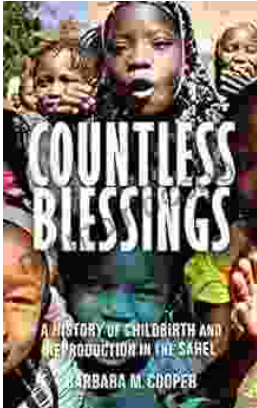
