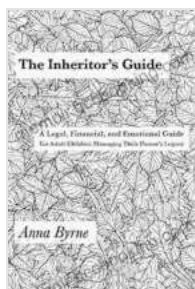

The Grantor reserves and shall have the exclusive right any time and from time to time during his/her lifetime by instrument in writing signed by the Grantor and delivered to the Trustee to modify or alter this Agreement, in whole or in part, without the consent of the Trustee or any beneficiary provided that the duties, powers and liabilities of the Trustee shall not be changed without his/her consent; and the Grantor reserves and shall have the right during his/her lifetime, by instrument in writing signed by the Grantor and delivered to the Trustee, to cancel and amend this Agreement without the consent of the Trustee or any beneficiary hereof. 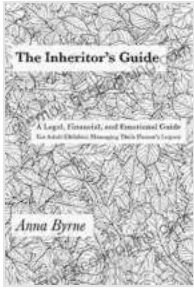

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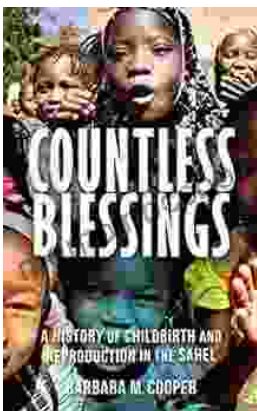


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
