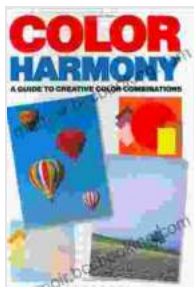

The split-complementary color scheme is a variation of the complementary color scheme. It differs in that each color is equidistant to a pair of complementary colors.

Example: Yellow, Red-Violet and Blue-Violet

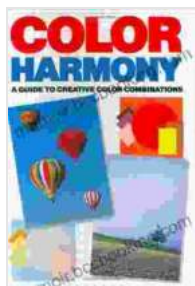
