
William Dampier: A Life of Adventure and Discovery



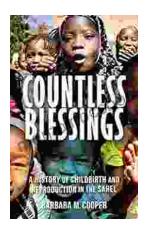
